## City Council hears audit report

**Henry Davis CPA, partner with Doshier, Pickens and Francis, LLC, presented the audit report to the Dalhart City Council on Tuesday evening.**

After the Dalhart City Council heard a presentation on the fiscal year 2016-2017 audit during Tuesday's meeting, City Manager James Stroud expressed pride in the various department heads.

"They try to keep good tabs on the money," Stroud said. "They stay within the parameters of the budget" except when emergencies might arise, such as a vehicle breaking down.

The audit report, prepared by Doshier, Pickens and Francis, LLC of Amarillo, was delivered by Henry Davis CPA, a partner with the accounting firm. The audit report provided opinions of the way the City of Dalhart handles the financial procedures.

The report topped 60 pages and broke down financials in different and complex ways.

At the conclusion of Davis' review, Mayor Phillip Hass asked, "In your opinion, is everything okay?"

"Yes, the city's in good financial shape," Davis responded.

One recommendation Davis made, and which assistant city manager and finance director Brent Walker will be implementing is simplifying the yearly budget paperwork.

In other business, the council unanimously approved the 2018-2019 budget, which begins October 1, and the tax rate of \$0.3836 per \$100 of taxable property value. This is a 7.96 percent increase over the previous year.

Other unanimous votes approved an ordinance for penalties to defray the cost

of collecting unpaid taxes which, according to Stroud, is done yearly, and a rezoning request to place a new manufacturer home on the lot at 101 Dodson.

Two ordinances were passed which will offer health insurance to retirees and City Council members going forward. Stroud clarified that employees who have already retired, or previous council members, are not eligible for the insurance.

## County Commissioners approve budgets, tax rates

While it may seem routine - as well as redundant and time-consuming - business for the Dallam County Commissioners to review invoices before they are paid during their monthly meeting, the practice does make sense.

On Monday, Commissioner Corey Crabtree found an error on one invoice, saving the county over \$400.

Once the meeting started in earnest, the commissioners unanimously approved the fiscal year 2018-2019 budget for Dallam County, and the tax rate for that period, which remains at 35.5 cents per \$100 of taxable property value.

The Records Preservation \$30,000 budget for fiscal year 2018-2019 was approved, with the funds generated by fees charged for county documents.

Fees for the county sheriff and constable will remain the same, as voted by the commissioners. These fees are equal to those charged in Hartley County, according to Terri Banks, Dallam county clerk.

The commissioners approved a resolution declaring September as National Emergency Preparedness Month, and approved the list of election judges for the upcoming November 6 election.

A special meeting of the Commissioners Court will take place on September 24 at 10 a.m. This meeting will deal with matters related to the end of the 2017-2018 fiscal year, such as transferring money between departments and budget amendments, according to County Judge Wes Ritchey. "It's for financial housekeeping," he said.

Joined by the Hartley County Commissioners, the full body unanimously voted

to approve the tax rate of \$0.034882 per \$100 of taxable property value for Frank Phillips College.

The combined group received a presentation from Terri Hein, board member for Meals on Wheels.

Terri reported that more than 6,000 meals have been delivered in the past year, at a cost of over \$25,000. Both Dallam and Hartley County have made minimal donations in years past, to enable Meals on Wheels to receive a Texas Department of Agriculture grant.

Terri explained there will be no application for that grant this year. A number of area restaurants have signed on to donate one meal a month to the program, which will significantly reduce the program costs.

The commissioners voted to donate a combined total of approximately \$600 to Meals on Wheels.

The Dallam Hartley County Library report was delivered by Kinsey Nicholson, assistant library director. She provided a review of the summer reading programs, which saw youngsters reading over 47,000 minutes and scoring some fantastic prizes for their efforts.

The library will be partnering with Wonderland Amusement Park to provide tickets which will serve as incentives to keep youngsters reading throughout the year.

Staff from the Texas AgriLife Extension Office gave their reports to the commissioners, covering the XIT Arts and Crafts Show in early August, plans to aid local agriculture and dairy farmers, and developments with the 4-H program, including the new club formed in Texline.

"It will be a business September, October and November," said Bailee Wright, 4-H agent, with the focus on food and nutrition in the coming months.

I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a clear conscience, as I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. As I remember your tears, I long to see you, that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well. For this reason, I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, for God gave us a spirit not of fear, but of power and love and self-control." (2 Timothy 1:1-7)

Every time I read the letters from Paul to Timothy, I am continually amazed at the bond and love between these two men from different generations.

Their relationship is one that shows us how powerful it is when we pour into the younger generation. Paul knew how important the next generation was, so he took time out of his busy

schedule to lead Timothy and keep him focused on God.

All of us are called, like Paul, to lead and make disciples, but often we tend to focus too much on the differences between us and what we do not like in the younger generation, which leads us away from discipling them. This causes a lot of young people to head in the wrong direction, the same young people that could potentially be the future leaders of our community.

This year the school asked students a simple question: what are you passionate about and what are you doing to take care and feed the fire of that passion?

My question to us is: how are we helping lead our young people into a passion for Christ and how can we help feed the fire with them?

When I was in high school I had a coach, who began to pour into me and taught me to be on fire for excellence, love, and faith. The effort this coach made to disciple me truly changed my life and, to this day, I continue to model my life after him and the lessons he taught me.

There are so many kids today who would benefit from a relationship with a caring adult like that and, honestly - speaking as a young adult - they are craving it.

All we have to do as adults is what Paul did. Paul loved Timothy, thought about him, prayed for him, and taught him the truths of who God is and who God created Timothy to

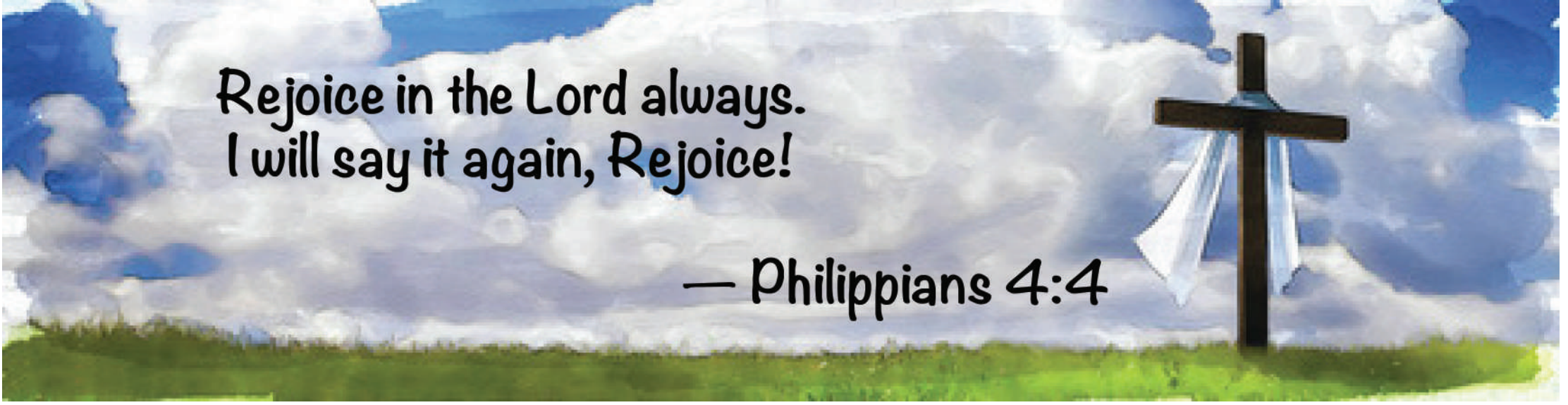

The Lady Wolves' junior high team also competed at the meet with an 11th overall finish in a field of 186 total runners and 16 total teams.

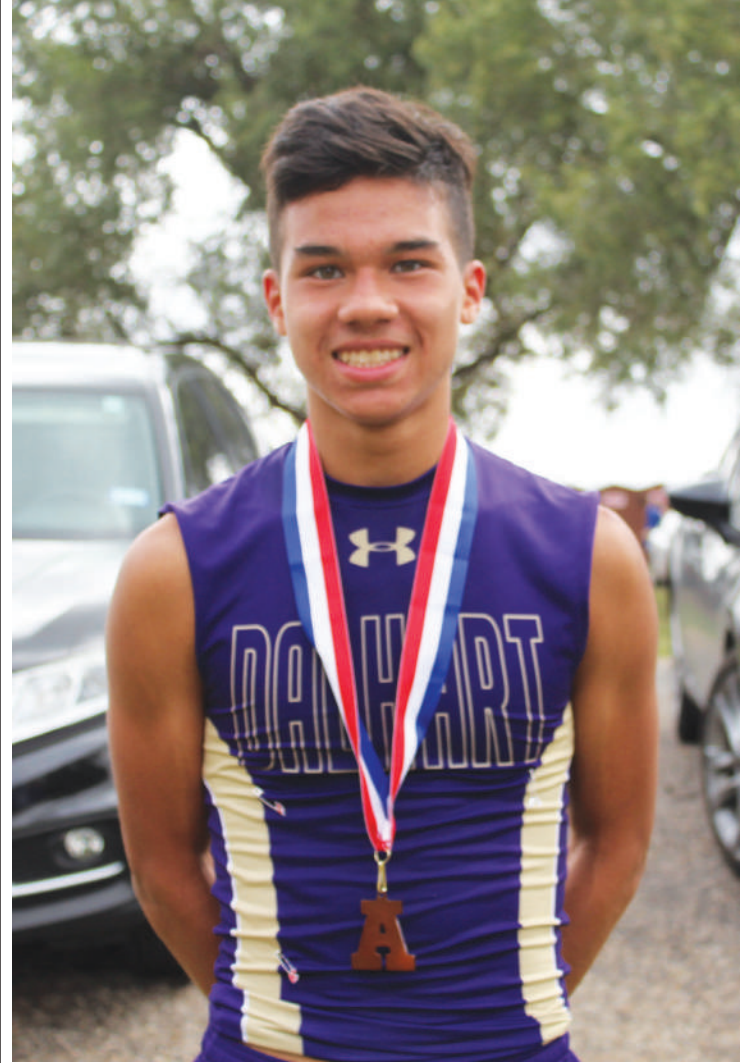

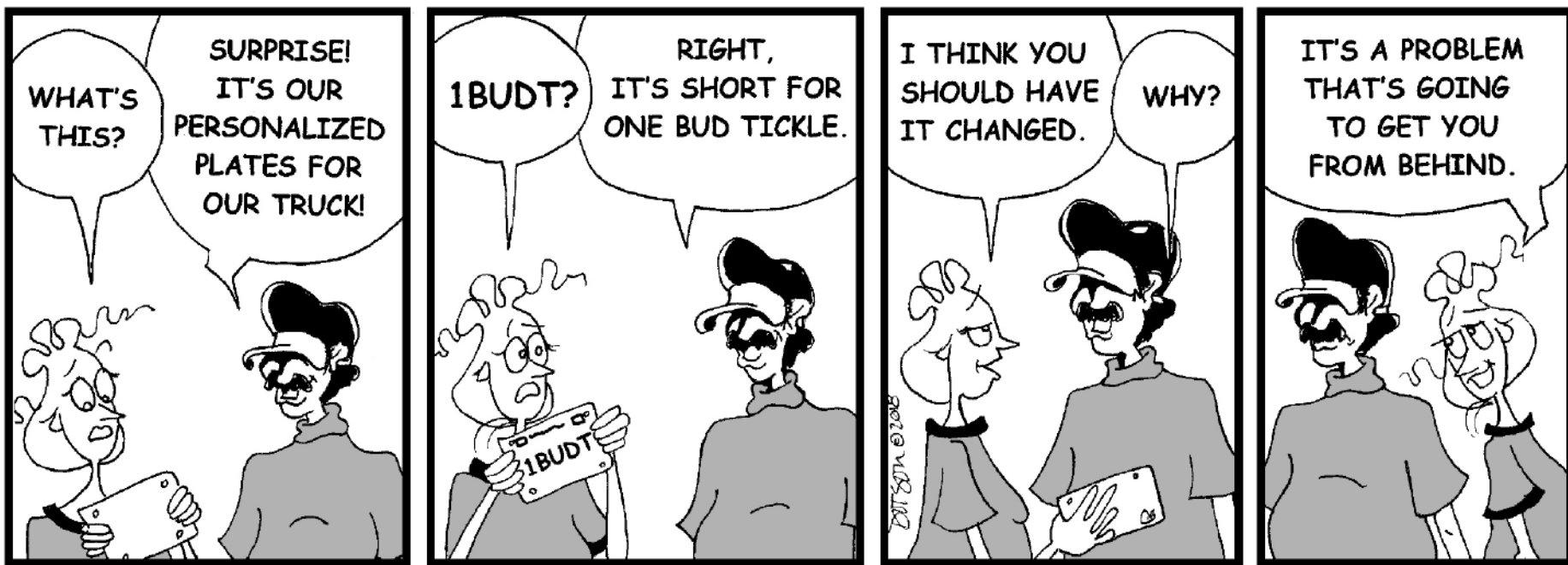
