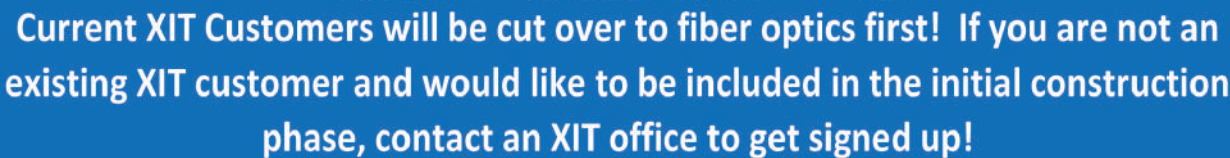

High Country clinic moves to new location

After opening the doors on a new location August 13, High Country Community Rural Health Clinic held an open house on August 16.

Stopping by to enjoy punch and cookies, Dallam Hartley Counties Health District employees, patients and the public were also taken on tours of the offices, examination rooms and lab space in the building at 310 Texas Boulevard.

Bruce Schubert, PA-C, welcomed the guests with a smile. He’s settling into his new office, in the same hall as the exam rooms where he’ll see patients.

For the next few weeks, he’ll be assisted by Ms. Alex Rodriguez, a student in the physician assistant program at Texas Tech University. This is Alex’s first rotation as part of her studies.

Bruce explained how the physician assistant program developed. “In an age when there was a shortage of primary care physicians, medics came back from Vietnam” wanting to pursue a career in medicine. Rather than make them go through medical school, it

was decided to take advantage of their prior experience and train them in a shorter period of time.

Bruce works with Randy Herring MD to provide comprehensive care to the patients, even offering a walk-in clinic for acute cases most mornings from 7-8:30 a.m. Department of Transportation and railroad physicals are available at the clinic, as well.

Amanda Cox MSN also has office space in the new building, with the entire staff always ready to make sure their patients receive the best care available.

Riding with James Stroud

Given my newness to the Dalhart area, when I heard about the new shooting range at a Commissioners Court meeting some weeks back, I had no idea of the location.

Dalhart City Manager James Stroud took some time out of his day last week to drive me out to the site.

Not difficult to find, really; I'd been quite close when I covered the XIT Mud Bog earlier this month.

The area is perfect for use as a gun range, with natural hills on two sides to provide a shield.

Not that it's near any housing.

The range – which is in the early stages of development – is located south of the Lake Rita Blanca spillway.

The project is a combined effort of the City of Dalhart, both Dallam and Hartley Counties, and the Lake Board.

The Lake Board is an advisory body, with members being the two county judges, Wes Ritchey and Ronnie Gordon, Stroud, Dalhart Mayor Phillip Hass,

and two members of the public.

There are quite a number of regulations the shooting range will have to meet, and funding is still being sought through grants and other sources. It will initially allow for pistol shooting, and use by 4-H archery and rifle teams.

Eventually, the range will be open to the public.

Mr. Stroud believes the new location will be more suitable than the current site near Dalhart Municipal Airport, which is close to highways and other developments.

While out in the area, Mr. Stroud showed me damage done to picnic tables set up under shelters near the lake, including one completely burned. The spillway walls are covered with graffiti, and one of the gates has been badly damaged by vehicles slamming into it to force it open.

The City Council previously voted to close of the section near the spillway to all vehicle traffic, to prevent more damage.

Mr. Stroud likes the area around the lake, and is

very proud of the many trees planted in the park, and the eight miles of walking trails that have turned the canyon into a popular site for walkers, bikers and nature enthusiasts.

For those – like me – with a fear of snakes, the trail is white, so anything crawling nearby would be easily noticed.

Cattle continue to graze in the area, too.

While it's no longer possible to swim, boat or fish in Lake Rita Blanca, it is a beautiful area, and I appreciate Mr. Stroud showing it to me.

NPGCD Lowers Tax Rate, Pursues Capital Improvements

October 1 will mark the beginning of a new fiscal year for the North Plains Groundwater Conservation District. At the August 8 meeting of the Board of Directors, members discussed and voted on items to wrap up the current fiscal year, adopt a new tax rate, and plan for future budgetary needs.

Property owners in Texas pay ad valorem taxes each year that fund certain entities that benefit the community. Ad valorem is a Latin phrase translating to “according to value,” which means ad valorem taxes are based upon property value. Every property is taxed by its county and its local school district, and usually exist in the jurisdiction of other taxing units such as hospitals, community colleges, water districts, cities, and fire departments. According to the Texas Comptroller's website, each county's appraisal district is tasked with estimating the value of all properties within the county. Over the summer, each taxing unit will receive a list of properties and values, and they must adopt tax rates for their operations. The North Plains GCD Board of Directors voted to adopt an effective tax rate of \$0.033136 per \$100 of property value. An effective tax rate gives the taxing entity the same amount of funds it received the previous year, meaning the rate itself may go up or down depending on property values. Within the North Plains GCD, property values increased, so the new tax rate is lower than last year's \$0.0333714/\$100. Funds received from ad valorem taxes make up a significant part of the district's budget and supply money for programs provided for the public such as water quality testing, 4th grade water festivals, adult education programs, agricultural conservation demonstrations, and more.

As the North Plains GCD fiscal year comes to an end, some expenditures were spent under their budgeted amount. The board voted to reallocate the savings to other parts of the budget, mostly for capital expenses, including the addition of a road and new sign at the North Plains Water Conservation Center, covered park-

ing across the street from the Dumas office, and a replacement vehicle for field staff.

Another money-saving motion passed by the directors affects the Dallam County Priority Groundwater Management Area (PGMA). After being annexed into North Plains GCD in August of 2013, property owners within that area elected not to pay ad valorem taxes to the district. Instead, non-exempt well owners in the PGMA pay fees to the

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district based on the amount of groundwater pumped, from \$1.00 to \$5.00 per acre-foot, depending on use.

As the effective tax rate has progressively decreased in 2016, 2017, and 2018, it was recommended that the production fees decrease too. The directors approved a 10% reduction in production fees for those well owners within the PGMA starting in 2019.

Other motions approved by the board include a proposal for a new parking structure at the Dumas office, all pending well permits, and the 2018-2019 budget. Reports were given regarding the activities and discussions of the Property Committee and Agriculture Committee. The next meeting of the North Plains GCD Board of Directors will take place on Tuesday, September 11th, at 9:30am at the North Plains Water Conser-

vation Center. Public comments are always welcome – please check www.northplainsgcd.org the week before the meeting to view the agenda.

North Plains Groundwater Conservation District is a regional conservation entity authorized by the Texas Legislature, and dedicated to maintaining our way of life through conservation, protection, and preservation of our groundwater resources. The district is governed by an elected Board of Directors representing the area it serves – Dallam, Sherman, Hansford, Ochiltree, Lipscomb, Hartley, Moore, and Hutchinson counties. Lady Wolves see mixed results at River Road Tournament

The Dalhart Lady Wolves stayed in the Panhandle this past weekend for their second tournament of the 2018 season, competing at the River Road Tournament in Amarillo.

The Lady Wolves ended up winning three games and losing three games during the tournament, making it to the championship game of the silver bracket before losing to district rival Pampa in two very close games.

The Lady Wolves started out in Pool D on Friday, playing in the middle school gym at River Road. They went up against Idalou first and won that match in two straight games, both with a score of 25-22.

The Sanford-Fritch Lady Eagles were up next for Dalhart. The Lady Wolves won the first game by a score of 25-21. The Lady Eagles kept the next game even closer than the first, but Dalhart was able to pull out the win by two points, 25-23.

The third game on Friday was against Canutillo, a high school near El Paso. The first game was very exciting, as neither team was able to pull very far ahead. The score was tied 24-24, sending the game into overtime since a win by two points is required.

The game went back and forth before being tied at 29-29. Canutillo was then able to score two straight points and win by a final of 31-29.

Canutillo went on to win the second game 25-17, handing the Lady Wolves their only loss in pool play two games to none.

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The Lady Wolves were seeded second and placed in the gold/silver bracket on Saturday, taking on Plainview in their first match. Plainview won the first game 25-18. The Lady Wolves kept the second game close, but Plainview was able to pull that game out as well by a score of 25-22, taking the match 2-0.

That loss sent the Lady Wolves to the silver side of the bracket against San Jacinto Christian Academy. The Lady Patriots were able to win the first game 25-21. Dalhart then came back to win the second game by the same score, 25-21, sending the match to a third game.

The Lady Wolves played one of their best games of the tournament in that deciding game, beating San Jacinto by ten points, 25-15. That put the Lady Wolves in the championship game of the silver bracket.

Dalhart took on district rival Pampa in the championship game Saturday afternoon. The Lady Harvesters jumped out to an early lead in the first game, and Dalhart never came closer than a one-point spread. The Lady Harvesters were able to maintain the lead. Pampa won that first game 25-22.

The Lady Wolves jumped out to a 4-1 lead in the second game. After Pampa tied the score 4-4, the game went back and forth. The Lady Harvesters were then able to take the lead for good, although Dalhart kept it close. Pampa won that game 25-21, taking the match 2-0.

The Lady Wolves have an open date tonight, and will play in their final tournament of the season this weekend, traveling to the Wolforth Frenship Tournament Friday and Saturday.

The teams will play their first home game one week from today, taking on West Texas High on August 28.

Electronics recycling event not happening this year

For anyone who might have an old computer or printer, or other electronic device that no longer works, throwing it out with the regular trash isn't an option.

In past years, a yearly electronics recycling event was held in the Dalhart area, allowing people to drop off their old electronics for free.

This year, that won't be happening. Organized by the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission, the cost of recycling the electronics was covered by a sponsor.

Due to the high costs that were incurred, the sponsor has withdrawn from the program, according to Lori Gunn of PRPC.

"Without a sponsor to cover the tens of thousands of dollars of costs involved for our region, we cannot maintain the program," Gunn said.

Gunn did offer other ways to recycle electronics. "Most of the stores that sell electronics have recycling options." The cost of recycling older electronics is built into the cost of the new items being purchased.

The seller of the new item should take the customer's old electronics in for recycling, Gunn added. "This will prevent these items from going to the landfill and prevent the possibility of some toxic items leaching into the soil and/or water supply."

Gunn continued that another option is for residents to sell their electronics to a refurbishment company. "There are several that will take old electronics and refurbish them, then resell," she said.

Refurbishing is a different process than recycling, Gunn explained. It is important for owners of old electronics to make certain any personal information stored on the device has been erased before selling it to be refurbished because, unlike recycling – where the materials are broken down and melted – refurbishing could leave someone liable for sensitive or proprietary information on the hard drives.

Goodwill Industries of Northwest Texas locations in Amarillo and other locations do continue to accept electronics for recycling at no charge, according to Robin Raney, chief executive officer. The Amarillo Goodwill location is at 1904 Bell Street.

Criteria for Free and Reduced-Price Meal Benefits

The following criteria will be used to determine a child's eligibility for free or reduced-price meal benefits:

Income

1. Household income that is at or below the income eligibility levels
2. Household receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF); or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) Program Participant
3. Child's status as a foster child, homeless, runaway, migrant, or displaced by a declared disaster
4. Child's enrollment in Head Start or Even Start

Income Eligibility

For those households that qualify for free or reduced-price meals based on income, an adult in the household must fill out free and reduced-price meal application and return it to {insert name, title, and contact information}. Those individuals filling out the application will need to provide the following information:

1. Names of all household members
2. Amount, frequency, and source of current income for each household member
3. Last 4 digits of the Social Security number of the adult household member who signs the application or, if the adult does not have a social security number, check the box for "No Social Security number"
4. Signature of an adult household member attesting that the information provided is correct

Categorical or Program Eligibility

Dalhart ISD is working with local agencies to identify all children who are categorically and program eligible.

Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may also be verified by the school officials at any time during the school year. Applications are available at Dalhart ISD, 701 East 10th Street Dalhart, Texas 79022.

Determining Eligibility

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal policy, Janet Hartrim will review applications and determine eligibility. Households or guardians dissatisfied with the Reviewing Official's eligibility determination may wish to discuss the decision with the Reviewing Official on an informal basis. Households wishing to make a formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make a request either orally or in writing to Dr. Joe Alcorta, Superintendent 806-244-7810.

Unexpected Circumstances

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the children of the household eligible for benefits if the household's income falls at or below the attached current income eligibility guidelines.
