Commissioners Court approves budget amendments

In a special meeting Monday morning, the Dallam County Commissioners Court learned that the 2018 fiscal year will end on a good note.

After approving budget amendments to add \$43,975.40 in funds received from the state, adjust the constable's budget by \$1,000 to cover costs of mileage and conferences, and adjust the road and bridge account by more than \$36,000 to cover additional repairs to equipment and other expenses, County Judge Wes Ritchey announced the current year will come in between \$150,000 and \$200,000 under budget.

In other business, the commissioners voted to move the polling location in Texline from the City Hall to the Texline Community Center.

Terri Banks, Dallam County and District Clerk, explained the plan had been in place previously, when the polling location was being moved from the school in Texline. The community center, at that point, was not available. This move would allow for a more neutral voting site, she added, with no other business taking place in the building on election day.

The commissioners also formalized membership on the election committee, which consists of Terri Banks, Wes Ritchey, Jami Parr, Selene Schumacher and DeLeasa

Roy Neukam, Dumas Area Engineer for the Texas Department of Transportation, gave a report on upcoming improvements to U.S. Highway 54, west of Dalhart. Once bids are received - with the process starting in January 2019 - work to add six passing lanes to the road should begin about March, lasting 18 months.

"We've needed this project for a long time," Neukam said. The cost will be approximately \$39 million.

The project will add "rumble strips" at the center and edge lines of the roadway, to increase safety, and a center turn lane from the bridge to 998, according to Neukam.

Neukam provided progress reports on other "meat and potatoes" projects around the county, noting that funds from the state are necessary to complete a lot of work on

Farmers & Stockmens Bank Athlete of the Week

Alejandro Chavez is the Farmers & Stockmens Bank Male Athlete of the Week. Chavez is a senior cross country runner for Hartley High School and is one of the fastest Class 1A cross country runners in Texas.

Chavez won the Class 1A division of the Lubbock ISD Invitational on September 22, running the 3-mile course in 16 minutes, 6.6 seconds. This was over a minute faster than the next runner, who ran the course in 17 minutes, 15.9 seconds.

Chavez's time was not just good enough to win the Class 1A division, but would have been fast enough to win both the Class 3A and Class 4A divisions, as well. Chavez would have been second in class 5A and only seven Class 6A runners were able to run the course in a faster time, making him one of the fastest runners in the region in any classification.

Chavez actually ran that same course over 30 seconds faster last year, winning the regional individual championship. He led the Hartley boys to their first ever trip to state as a team and is one of the favorites to win both regional and state in Class 1A this year.

Honorable Mention

LaDaryl Smith: Dalhart football. LaDaryl had a very good game in a tough loss to Shallowater on September 21. He scored all three of the Wolves' touchdowns during the game and ran for 71 yards on nine carries. He was also the leading receiver for Dalhart, with four receptions for 58 yards.

Carson Smith: Dalhart football. Carson Smith had four receptions for 55 yards for Dalhart in their game against Shallowater on September 21. He also played very well on defense and was one of the Wolves' leading tacklers.

Xaviar Hammett: Dalhart football. Hammett was the leading rusher for the Gold-

en Wolves' in their game against the Shallowater Mustangs. He had ten carries for 83 yards, averaging 8.3 yards per rush.

Hugo Davila: Dalhart football. Davila had four receptions for 45 yards for an average of 11.25 yards per reception during the game against Shallowater. He also played well on defense and had three punts with an average of 32 yards per punt.

Dalhart cross country teams run in Lubbock

The Dalhart High cross country teams competed at the Lubbock ISD Invitational at Mae Simmons Park last Saturday.

The Lady Wolves placed 12th overall in the Class 4A division, which included 19 total teams and 128 total runners. The Lady Wolves' score put them just ten points out of tenth place and 16 points behind ninth.

Maly Delgado once again led the Lady Wolves, placing 16th overall with a time of 12 minutes 40.2 seconds, Delgado's best time of the season and good enough for a medal.

The Wolves were the second ranked team from their district to compete at the meet and were six points behind fifth place and 25 points behind fourth place. Improvement before the regional meet will give the Wolves an excellent chance at advancing to state as a team.

Henry Alcorta was Dalhart's top runner at the Lubbock meet. He recorded his best time of the season and won a medal for placing 18th as an individual with a time of 17 minutes, 17.4 seconds.



He also railed about how many states have legalized marijuana, the benefits of that drug medically, and why it was problematic Texas had not yet followed suit.

Finally, I cut him off, asking what point he intended to make.

That's when he admitted his experience passing through Dalhart involved a traffic stop for speeding, during which he was caught with marijuana in his vehicle and

He complained about the conditions in the Dallam-Hartley County Jail, and how inmates were treated. Adding that

been in jail before, he was outraged at the "trap" up by local law enforcement. He claimed to have hired "high profile" local lawyer

to beat the charges he was facing.

He wanted me to expose the situation in Dalhart.

He was informed, if I would undertake such an investigation, I would have to include both sides of the story in any article, not just his conjectures. Already, I realized he was spitting in the wind, because the facts of the arrest would likely destroy his version.

I invited him to write a letter to the editor, if he was so concerned. If I ever receive it, it may be printed.

What struck me, however, is this man's failure to take responsibility for his actions, to realize that the laws of a state must be followed, regardless of personal

I recently read this "Introduction to Property Law, from a Child's Perspective:"

If I like it, it's mine.

If I can take it away from you, it's mine. If I had it a while ago, it's mine.

If I say it is mine, it's mine. If it looks like mine, it's mine.

If I say I saw it first, it's mine.

If you're having fun with it, it's mine.

If you lay down your toy, it's mine.

If it is broken, it's yours.

It's seems like we're born with discontented hearts. Always wanting more. And as we grow older, unfortunately, we don't outgrow it. We spend a lot of our lives discontent.

Contentment is a state of peace, or satisfaction. Are you content right now? Are you generally satisfied with your finances, job, relationships, health, and life?

Or are you discontent? Are you unhappy, unsatisfied, not at peace? Do you consistently wish that you had a little more? A little more land. A little more money. A little more health.

The Bible teaches that you can be content in the circumstances you're in right now. "Things" don't make you content, therefore getting more things won't actually make you satisfied. There is nothing else that you can get that will actually make you content.

We should know this from the experiences we have in life. Have you ever eagerly desired a new job, and then, once you got it . . . you were disappointed? Have you ever saved for a new car, and then when you got it . . . you weren't as content with it as you thought you'd be?

We should also know this because the Bible tells us that if we have food and covering (clothing & shelter) we can be content. 1 Timothy 6:8 teaches that we can be content with these bare necessities.

"Godliness with contentment is great gain." Pastor Philip Ryken says that "godliness is the knowledge of Jesus Christ in the mind and the heart that is worked out through the Christian life."

So the key to contentment is first to know Jesus Christ. This is more than simply knowing who Jesus is. (Almost everyone in Dalhart knows who Jesus is.) This kind of "knowledge" of God is turning from your sin and trusting in Him to be your Savior and Lord. (Not everyone in Dalhart knows Jesus this way.) This kind of relationship with Jesus changes you from the inside out.

In times of death or tragedies, preachers often mistakenly use Romans 8:28 in an effort to comfort people. It states, "All things work together for good to them that love God."


It is possible for those who love God to backslide, to cease believing and to meet God in that sorry condition. Is this for their good? Neither are many other things that could happen to them.

Hospital changes open up jobs

When Loree Tamayo, the new chief executive officer at the Dallam Hartley Counties Hospital District, came on board in August, she promised changes within the district.

Those changes have already started, opening up positions in the district.

Some of the posted positions include:

Director of Human Resources Director of Outpatient Services

Director, Legacy Assisted Living

The district has a need for registered nurses, licensed vocational nurses and nurse aides, as well.

Tamayo's goals include making the district "financially stable" and ensuring "patient care comes first."

At her first meeting with the district's board of directors, Tamayo indicated she had already begun the process of talking with department heads and, with the assistance of chief financial officer Joe Bradick, find ways to bring about cost savings and efficiency. Improving patient wait times at the clinics and bringing an orthopedic surgeon to Dalhart at

least once per month are among her other plans.

Another plan in the works is a lawsuit against Resolution Consulting, Inc, hoping to recover some of the funds lost by that firm's mismanagement while contracted to perform services for the district.

Rumors have been circulating in recent weeks about hospital and district employees who have left or been moved to different positions. Tamayo has been asked to address these issues, officially, especially since taxpayer funds are part of the district's annual budget.

Tamayo originally had Emily DeJong, the district's marketing director, send a press release, written in the first person, to the Dalhart Texan on September 24 regarding the changes taking place in the district. On September 25, Emily phoned to say that board members had expressed concern about the press release, and did not want it run at this time.

The contents of the above article are public knowledge, with much of the information already available on the DHCHD website, especially under "Career Opportunities."
